Proclamation

WHEREAS, there are more than 116,000 traffic crashes annually in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, thousands of emergency responders work tirelessly every day to keep Wisconsin's highways safe; and

WHEREAS, at every crash scene, emergency responders representing fire, law enforcement, emergency medical services, towing, and transportation agencies are at risk of being struck and either injured or killed; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin drivers should be taking every precaution on the road to be safe and reduce the risk of secondary crashes; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin has a "Move Over Law" that is designed to provide a safety zone for workers on the side of roadways; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin joins state and federal agencies in recognizing November 13 – 19 as Traffic Incident Response Week; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation is working with emergency response agencies to raise awareness about highway crash safety during this week;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim November 13 – 19, 2017 as




throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.
