Columbia County Solid Waste Committee June 3, 2013

Approved Minutes

Present: Mark Sleger, Ken Hutler, Robert McClyman and Phil Baebler

Excused with approval: Susanna Bradley

Also Present: Vern Gove-County Board Vice-Chair, Craig Cawley-Pacific Town Supervisor, Greg Kaminski and Carole Beix recording secretary.

Chairman Sleger called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. noting that the meeting had been properly noticed. Hutler made a motion to approve the agenda as presented second by McClyman. Motion carried.

Chair Sleger recommended a change to Safety Update by adding 62 days with no injuries and 27 days with no accidents on the May 6th minutes. Motion was made by McClyman to approve the May 6th minutes as amended and the May 15th special meeting minutes, second by Baebler. Motion carried.

Town of Pacific

No complaints and there are no concerns.

Expenditures

Expenditures were presented for payment. Motion to approve expenditure report as presented made by Hutler, second by Baebler. Motion carried.

Budgets and Compensatory Time

Compensatory time is in line with county policy.

Budgets are in line with expenses. Hauling costs will be higher than anticipated due to the large amount of garbage that needs to be shipped. Discussion followed.

Correspondence

Kaminski stated that he has received notification that the DNR will be here to do their annual inspection on Friday, June 14th. Discussion followed.

Safety update

Kaminski stated that there have been no injuries for 90 days and no accidents for 55 days. Staff is focusing on OSHA training. Discussion followed.

Uniform Proposals

Our uniform contract is up on July 1, 2013. Kaminski handed out a spreadsheet showing that Aramark was the low bidder. Discussion followed. Motion was made by McClyman to accept the low bid from Aramark, second by Baebler. Motion carried.

Recycling Market

Recycling market dropped slightly in May. Kaminski stated to the committee that it would be to our best interest to bale the plastic rather than have it go into co-mingling to help increase revenue. Discussed the possibly of looking into machinery that would help in the separating of recyclables.

Operations Report

Kaminski passed around a spread sheet showing that the amount of garbage being shipped out is greater than the amount that came in, which shows that the building is starting to get cleared out. The goal is to have the building emptied by the end of June. Drum one is empty and drum two will be emptied by the end of the day. Discussed the problem the trucking company is having trying to get enough trucks to haul the material away. It was suggested that Kaminski look into having an additional trucking company brought in if it is necessary to be sure that the building is cleared before the end of the month.

The committee will review in six months whether it will be feasible to resume the compost process.

The next Solid Waste Committee meeting will be Monday, July 1st, 2013 at 9:30 a.m.
