Dr. John McAuliffe

Dr. John McAuliffe earned his undergraduate degree at the University of Wisconsin Madison. He continued on to earn his doctorate at the UW's Medical School in 1973. Currently, Dr. McAuliffe is the Medical Director of the Sauk Prairie Healthcare. He has been very involved in the care of those suffering addictions, in the local H.E.L.P (Health, Education, Law Enforcement, Psychosocial) program, the Tri-County MATRS (Medication Assisted Treatment Recovery) program, as well as leading Prairie Clinic's Naltrexone Program. **Speaking on:** stats and scope of problem, biology of the addicted brain, community strategies to prevent overdose deaths, first responders and Naloxone, family practice physicians working with addicted patients, and medication assisted treatment.

Dr. Danny Sessler

Dr. Sessler is an internist in Baraboo. He received his medical degree from Medical College for Wisconsin and has been in practice for more than 20 years. His special interests are in addiction medicine and bronchoscopy. **Speaking on:** 3 MAT drugs and building positive outcomes, discussing the medication contract, counseling & case management of MAT, relapse, risk, and tapering.

Kevin Hylton, Ph.D.

Dr. Kevin Hylton is the Vice President of Technical Services at AQE Solutions where he is responsible for establishing the company's research and evaluation priorities. He lends over 20 years experience in applied social and behavioral research and evaluation to improving health disparities and educational inequities among underserved populations. Dr. Hylton recently served as the Senior Technical Lead for SAMHSA's CSAT/DSI Technical Assistance Contract for the Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral and Treatment (SBIRT) program area and as the Deputy Project Director for a multi-site evaluation of SAMHSA's Targeted Capacity Expansion (TCE)/HIV programs. Dr. Hylton holds a Ph.D. in Medical Sociology from Howard University, and M.S. and B.S. degrees from the State University of New York. **Speaking on: Community Engagement.**
