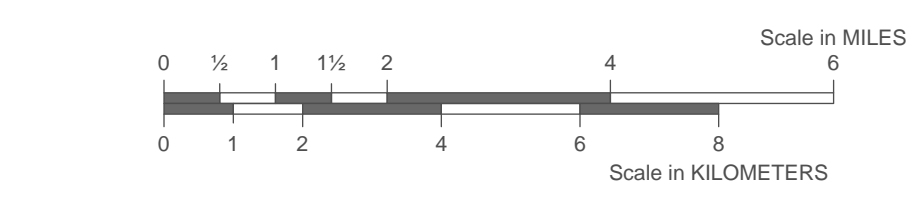


Recreation and Tourism Columbia County, Wisconsin

PUBLIC RECREATION LANDS AND PARKS

All areas are open to wildlife observation, hiking, cross-country skiing, nature study, and photography. Many US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Waterfowl Production Areas and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource (WDNR) public lands are open to hunting, trapping, and fishing. Check with the USFWS and WDNR before hunting public lands as these lands are subject to all applicable Federal and State laws.

RUSTIC ROADS

Rustic Road 69 (Old Agency House Road) and Rustic Road 49 (Levee Road)

The Rustic Roads System in Wisconsin was created to help preserve what remains of Wisconsin's scenic, lightly traveled country roads. These routes provide bikers, hikers, and motorists with an opportunity to leisurely travel the scenic countryside.

ICE AGE NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL SEGEMENTS

The Ice Age Trail relies heavily on the support of private landowners. Please respect their rights and stay on the trail at all times!

The Ice Age Trail is primarily for hiking, snowshoeing, and cross-country skiing. Other types of activities such as biking, horseback riding or snowmobiling are allowed only where clearly marked. Fires and camping are only allowed in designated areas. The Ice Age Trail is closed during deer gun season. Please use caution and wear bright colors during all other hunting seasons.

BARN QUILTS

Barn Quilts of Columbia County is a project of the Columbia County Association for Home and Community Education (HCE) and Columbia County UW-Extension. The mission is to celebrate the agricultural heritage of our county through the warmth and beauty of quilting art.

What are Barn Quilts? Each barn "quilt" is an 8' X 8' quilt square painted on plywood and mounted on the side of a barn or other farm structure.

CASCADE MOUNTAIN

Cascade Mountain is a skiing, snowboarding and snow tubing resort located within Columbia County near Portage and the Wisconsin Dells. It was established in 1961 and opened in 1962 as a small resort with eight trails and a few lifts. Today, the resort has 48 trails, 3 terrain parks, and an 800-foot-long chute for snow tubing. Generally, the ski season runs from December through March. Please see the Cascade Mountain website for additional information.
