**PLEASE NOTE:** It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to obtain or disclose personal information, from a motor vehicle record, for any use not permitted. It shall be unlawful for any person to make false representation to obtain any personal information from an individual's motor vehicle record. 18 U.S.C. § 2722(a) & (b). A person who knowingly obtains, discloses or uses personal information, from a motor vehicle record, for a purpose not permitted, shall be liable to the individual to whom the information pertains. The court may award: (1) actual damages, but not less than liquidated damages in the amount of \$2,500; (2) punitive damages upon proof of willful or reckless disregard of the law; (3) reasonable attorneys' fees and other litigation costs reasonably incurred; and (4) such other preliminary and equitable relief as the court determines to be appropriate.
