What is the Health Insurance Marketplace?

The Health Insurance Marketplace is a way to find health coverage that fits your budget and meets your needs.

Every health insurance plan in the Health Insurance Marketplace will offer basic health benefits covering:

- Doctor Visits
- Preventative Care
- Hospitalization
- Medications

You can compare plans based on price, benefits, quality and other features important to you before you make a choice.

Private Insurance Companies

Insurance plans in the Health Insurance Marketplace are offered by private companies and they cover the same set of basic health benefits. Health insurance companies can't deny you coverage or charge you more due to pre-existing health conditions.

Important things to know

- The Health Insurance Marketplace does not apply to you if:
 - You have affordable insurance through your job
 - You are enrolled in Medicare or the Family Care program
- 2. Visit **www.healthcare.gov** to learn more about health insurance. There you will find information about:
 - Young adults to age 26
 - Families with limited income
 - People with Medicaid
- Before you apply, make a list of questions. For example: "Can I stay with my current doctor?" or "Will this plan cover my health costs when I'm traveling?"
- 4. Make sure you understand the following terms:
 - Premiums (payments)
 - Deductibles (what you have to pay)
 - Out of pocket maximums (the most you have to pay)
 - Copayments (what you have to pay)
- 5. How much can you spend each month on a payment?
- Medicare benefits are <u>not</u> changing. The Marketplace is not for Medicare enrollment. If you are eligible for Medicare, this information does not apply to you.
