What is Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)?

MAT is a person centered wrap around model of support and service programs to individuals struggling with opioid or stimulant drug addictions. Services may include information, education withdrawal support, comprehensive AODA and Mental Health Assessment, recovery planning, case management services, access and referral to Vivitrol & Suboxone providers, referrals to doctors and clinics for primary medical concerns, behavioral health needs, community resources, and /or working with your family and loved ones in establishing or reestablishing healthy supportive relationships.

MAT Programs

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) is a grant funded program that is a voluntary, free program for adult residents of Columbia County with an opioid or stimulant addictions.

Nonnarcotic, Non-addictive, Injectable Medication (NNAI) is a grant funded program that is a voluntary, free program for adult residents of Columbia County incarcerated in the Columbia County Jail needing supports for their opioid addictions prior to re-entry into the community and support following release up to 60 days.
