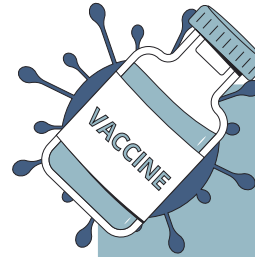

COLUMBIA COUNTY COVID-19 WEEKLY UPDATE

AS OF OCTOBER 27, 2021:

Wisconsin is currently seeing very high levels of community transmission of COVID-19. It is important to know that attending gatherings and celebrations, especially those that are hosted indoors, increases the risk of getting and spreading COVID-19.

This Halloween, the Department of Health Services (DHS) recommends avoiding indoor gatherings or celebrations and encourages physically-distanced outdoor activities when possible. If your community plans to host trick-or-treating this year, it is recommended that individual grab bags be placed outside for children to take for a contact-free experience.

Attending gatherings increases your risk of getting and spreading COVID-19.



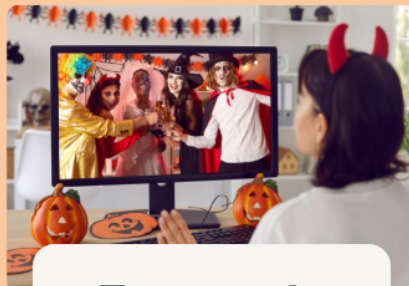
