Key COVID-19 Data Summary for Columbia County as of February 17th

- Total confirmed positive test results: 4,963 (+42 since 2/10/21)
(Includes active, recovered, deceased)
- Active cases: 67 (-32 since 2/10/21)
- Total probable test results: 375 (+5 since 2/10/21)
- Total ever hospitalized: 261 (+2 since 2/10/21)
- Individuals recovered: 4,845 (+70 since 2/10/21)
- Total deaths of people confirmed positive: 50 (+4 since 2/10/21)
- Total deaths of people probable results: 8 (0 since 2/10/21)
- Total negative cases: 26,134 (+288 since 2/10/21)
- Total number of active investigations by setting: 46 (-10 since 2/10/21)
